**FEDERAL DEFENDANTS' SECOND  
UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXCEED PAGE LIMITATIONS**

Federal defendants Alberto Gonzales, Attorney General of the United States, and Karen Tandy, Administrator of the United States Drug Enforcement Agency, (“Federal Defendants”) respectfully move the Court for permission to file a reply brief that exceeds the five (5) page limit in LR 7.1(g). Federal Defendants seek an additional twelve (12) pages to be allotted to their Reply Memorandum in Support of Their Motion to Dismiss (“Federal Defendants’ Reply Memorandum”).

Good cause exists for Federal Defendants’ Reply Memorandum to exceed the current page limitation. Plaintiff’s Original Complaint for Declaratory and Injunctive Relief (dkt. no. 1) (Jan. 16, 2007) is thirty-two pages long and sets forth ten different causes of action that raise numerous statutory and constitutional claims and issues. Further, the Memorandum of Law in Support of Plaintiff’s Response to Federal Defendants’ Motion to Dismiss (dkt. no. 28) (Apr. 30, 2007) is twenty-nine pages long and presents numerous arguments in opposition to Federal Defendants’ Motion to Dismiss. Additional pages are required to effectively address each of plaintiff’s arguments. Federal Defendants have sought and received one previous extension of

page limitations.

Undersigned counsel for Federal Defendants has conferred with plaintiff, and plaintiff consents to Federal Defendants' request for additional pages.

Accordingly, for the reasons stated above, Federal Defendants respectfully request that the Court grant their second unopposed motion to exceed page limitations and allow Federal Defendants a total of seventeen (17) pages for their Reply Memorandum in Support of Their Motion to Dismiss.

A proposed order is attached.
